I have resigned myself to accept the fact that winter is coming to the Mohawk Valley and Adirondack Mountains, my little piece of heaven in Central New York State. Instead of bemoaning the fact that it is getting colder by the day and we are waking up to snow on the ground, I've decided to pull out the old insulated underwear and to enjoy the winter. At least Christmas is always worth waiting for. I remember what a special time it was for me as a child.

Everything centered around Christmas Eve. Santa was second place to the traditions that enfolded that night. I remember rushing home in the dark after finishing my paper route and spotting the first star in the sky. That was when Christmas Eve dinner was to start. They would wait for me, and my mother would have just gotten home from work. Thank God for my Babcia (grandmother), who lived with us, and even though crippled, managed to get most of the dinner on the stove.

It was a small group around the table. Babcia, my mom and two younger brothers (later it was my child-bride and then our two children). The table was set with our finest china and in the center resting on a pile of straw was the "Oplatek" (the unleavened bread, just as we receive in Communion, but larger sheets, illustrated with imprinted Christmas figures.

There was first the prayer led by my Babcia, an eggnog toast and then

Her students are severely multiply impaired, meaning that they have physical impairments as well as cognitive and learning issues. Sandy and other teachers will use this device, along with two others in the building regularly. The Detroit Regiment funded half the cost of another unit last year. On November 5th, Dale Gossiaux, Donald Stehlin, Eugene Sniezyk and myself visited the school to see Sandy's students use the TAPit. We received beautiful thank-you cards made by students.

Christ the King Comm. 475 & Aux. 399 Respond to the Call for Help ... Donate Food Items to ELWA Hospital; Celebrate Silver Jubilee

Brothers and Sisters of Christ the King Commandery #475 and Auxiliary #399 recently lend a helping hand to combat the growing setbacks in the country's overwhelmed healthcare delivery services, especially since the outbreak of the Ebola pandemic in the West African subregion in July this year; as 1st Lt. Augustine P. Gebeh reports.

In commemoration of their Silver Jubilee Anniversary, the Knights and Ladies at Christ the King undertook to feed the hungry sick in their community. The gesture replaced the festivities which had usually characterized the occasion in previous years.

Speaking to the Knights of St. John Journal, Worthy President Emmanuel Kailie said the decision to focus this year's landmark anniversary commemoration on almsgiving was a unanimous one from both the Brother and Sister of Christ the King. He said "we are called to charity as Knights and Ladies and giving the current situation in our country, the need to answer this call

cannot be over emphasized. Elaborate festivities and celebrations amid this plague is quite unwise a decision."

The combined 399/475 delegation made the donation at the ELWA hospital in Paynesville, near the Liberian Capital Monrovia. The delegation assured the ELWA family that they are not alone in this fight, but that the Knights of St. John International is offering prayers and supplications for Devine intervention to curb the spread of Ebola. "Greater Love has no man, than to lay down his life for a fellow man. Many of our health workers have lost their lives recently, trying to save the lives of their patients. These acts of valor will never be forgotten, and only God can repay such selflessness," Bro. Kailie averred.

Receiving the items on behalf of Dr. Brown, Head of the Hospital's Ebola Unit, the Administrator thanked the Knights of St. John for the thoughtfulness. She called on other well-meaning Liberians and other residents and aid agencies to emulate the examples of KSJI. "It does not have to be big", she said, "we need all the help and assistance we can get at this time. The hospital

is struggling and will highly appreciate donations like these and others like Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). Little is much when God is in it" the Administrator gratefully concluded.

In a related development, Bro. Nathaniel Toe reports that the Monrovia Grand Commandery (MGC) has donated several bags of rice and an assortment of other food items to the Star of the Sea Commandery in West Point, Monrovia, Liberia.

The gesture came as a quick impact response to provide desperately needed food items in the wake of the quarantining of that part of the city. Making the donation, Brigadier General Moeinti E. Young, Grand President of the Monrovia Grand Commandery, said it was the organization's way of identifying with Star of the Sea and other West Pointers in the time of national health crisis.

Receiving the donation, Deputy Grand Cadet Organizer, Ernest Tweh lauded the MGC for the gesture and promised to extend the kindness to other needed residents in the township.

Grand Commandery Knights of St. John International. It was a most impactful outing for the young ones.



We usually concentrated on those filled with potato & cheese, cheese only, and some sourkraut-filled. Homemade Polish babka bread spread with slabs of butter and coffee completed the meal.

When dinner was over, we kids settled down to just relax, or the young ones took a nap because we were all going to Midnight Mass. While my mother was washing

When Mass was over, we walked home in the snow, with our neighbors. A treat was waiting for us. No, it wasn't Santa Claus. We had fasted from meat all day, and now the fresh ham that Babcia put into the oven earlier in the evening would be done. That's when we dove into a ham spiced with allspice, cloves and garlic. Hot sandwiches on rye bread with a glass of ginger ale was my special treat. When my brothers went to bed, I helped Mom put their Santa gifts under the tree and headed for bed.

KSJI Muster & Inspection Report Forms 1 & 2 (KSJI MIR Forms 1 & 2) will be sent to you and you will send two copies of KSJI MIR Form 1 to each Local Commandery Commander, within your jurisdiction, to prepare the muster roll for their Local Commandery. The Local Commandery Commanders will present the two KSJI MIR Forms 1 to the Muster and Inspecting Officer(s). The Muster and Inspecting Officer(s) will complete the Muster Roll for each Local Commandery annotating on the two KSJI Forms 1 those members present or absent. The Muster and Inspecting Officer(s) will then complete the Inspection of each Local Commandery annotating on the two KSJI MIR Forms 1 the inspection of uniform items. One completed KSJI MIR Form 1 will be retained by the Local Commandery Commander for future reference and one sent to each District Commander, or in Brigades to the Colonel of each Regiment. As soon as these reports are received from all Local Commanderies, the Colonel or District Commander will transfer the information contained therein to the KSJI MIR Forms 2. When the KSJI MIR Forms 2 is complete, the Colonel or District Commander will have a number of copies made. The Colonel or District Commander will submit the KSJI MIR Forms 2 to their Supreme Subordinate Commandery or Grand Commandery who will compile all of their subordinate commands KSJI MIR Forms 2 for follow on submission to the KSJI, Supreme Commandery, Inspector General no later than January 17, 2015.
