Linus Ohanehi, past Grand Master of the Nigeria Temple and first Sergeant-at-Arms of Nigeria Grand Commandery. Those were followed by group discussions. The retreat closed with Holy Mass on Palm Sunday on  $24^{th}$  March 2013.

It was flagged off with a group session of stations of the cross with sisters of DDL followed by a talk on obstacles to group dynamism, the way forward" given by Rev. Fr. Liberatus Isife. He used the imagery of the animal code to detail unhelpful behavior and nuisances that affect group dynamism and recommended that we learn to accommodate others not tolerate them; be humble and submissive to constituted authority; try to be a bridge builder; face and conquer ones weakness and like the "story of the eagle" get rid of old memories, habits and other past traditions and embrace change. But that we should use prayers, humility and obedience and bridle our pride and passions to surmount. Pray to God to help us conquer self.

In his paper, Col. Ohanehi said growing in the order involves passing through and being passed through by the discipline, norms, purposes and usages of the Order. He made references to the scripture - Gospels of Mathew, Mark and Luke. He advised the Knights and Ladies to "light the candle rather than curse the darkness' - to remember the good things that come to them and bring something that will enliven the downhearted. # Kentucky Grand Commandery


Jack Zint was named the International Knight of the Year by the Knights of Saint John at the 2012 International Convention in Charlotte, N.C.



# Makurdi Grand Commandery

## The Event that Made History in our Land

If we must complete the history of Makurdi Grand Commandery, we shall recall some very important issues, among them was the first appearance of members of the Knights of St. John International at the installation of the first indigenous Catholic Bishop of Makurdi Diocese Most Rev. Athanasius Usuh as Co-adjutor Bishop. Led by the then Worthy President Brother Emmanuel Ezeabikwa of St Theresa Commandery 452 Jos these Catholic men well dressed and smart in action attracted Catholic men from Makurdi Diocese who started to aspire to join the group under Jos Local Commandery about three or four hours drive from Makurdi. This was a most interesting period as those who handled the aspirants treated them as new entrants into the Catholic faith. The training was both spiritual and physical. After some time the effort was rewarded with the initiation of five brothers into St. John the Baptist Squad in June, 1990. The lucky brothers were: Stephen Adole, Innocent Ama, Pius Ukpele, Ignatius Ojeikpo and Late Matthew Uka. These are very senior brothers who are still contributing their quota in the order except Matthew who has joined the ranks of the dead. Shortly after, in August 1990 nineteen brothers and a Reverend Father were initiated.

The men in the second batch of initiation were: Brothers John Mondeigh, Michael Egbeobi, Benard Omaiye, Simon Aondona, Jerome Hwande, Innocent Agev, Paulinus Mbah, Augustine Adiekwe, Sebastian Ibem, Boniface Anaeto, Philip Shinyi, Felix Gbillah and Godwin Nen-na. Others were: Philip Osakwe (expelled) Michael Okpara, (resigned). Those who have joined the ranks of the dead are: Rev. Fr. Alred Ashe, Brothers Benjamin Ejembi, Louis Uchubuilo, Patrick Nyam, and Joseph Ibout. These twenty four (24) men made the first most indigenous Local Commandery in the Northern part of Nigeria called Our Lady Of Perpetual Help Commandery 486 Makurdi.

It will be recalled that Col. Francis Adaji and Late brother Semion Bai who were indigenes of Benue State were already initiated members of this pious organization in Commandery 452 Jos.

Commandery 486 was thus inaugurated in 1991 in a colourful ceremony at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Cathe-

dral by the then Nigerian Grand President Brigadier General (Late) Bob Edinkemmelu (may his soul rest in peace). Col. Francis Adaji was the first Worthy President of this Local Commandery. It was from Our Lady of Perpetual Help Commandery 486 Makurdi that Local Commanderies were later created in Otukpo, Gboko, and Lafia. The work continued and we have thirteen Local Commanderies under the Makurdi Grand Commandery as at now. In our subsequent publications we shall tell you how these commanderies were born.

## Twenty One Gun Salute to Birg. Gen. N.N.N. Nwanesi

We can continue to express our gratitude for the creation of Makurdi Grand Commandery but let it be on record that a gentleman came in to necessitate the reality of the dream. In his first term in office as Abuja Grand President, Brigadier General N.N.N. Nwanesi pursued the creation of Makurdi Grand Commandery with every sincerity. We were not surprised when his dream came true and he will remain fresh in the minds of the people who own Makurdi Grand Commandery. It is not an easy task for creation of a new Grand Commandery but this gentleman made efforts to divide his Grand Commandery even from the date he was installed as Grand President. Abuja Grand Commandery had two Regiments: 1st Regiment with Headquarters in Abuja and 2<sup>nd</sup> Regiment with headquarters in Makurdi respectively. On ascending the throne, he instructed that all matters requiring the attention of Grand President in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Regiment be reported to his first vice who was in Makurdi to report same to him for action. As such the first vice assumed the powers of a Grand President in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Regiment reporting always to the Grand President. The two had a very cordial working relationship through which the Brigadier General pursued the cause of creation of the new Grand Commandery. The man can be described as a quiet achiever, a hero of our time and a bull dozer who does not hinder labourers from playing their part in the course of administration. History of Makurdi Grand Commandery will always carry the name of Nwanesi as the HERO who did not hesitate proposing a Grand Commandery for Makurdi and pursuing it to reality. The originator of this work was Major General Dan Okekenta, however, the two can be taken for the biblical Saul and David, while Saul killed thousands David (killed Goliath and he was regarded as having) killed tens of thousands. (1 Samuel 18:7). Although, Okekenta went to every corner and cranny of Benue and Nassarawa States propagating the image of the Order of Knights of St. John International, spending his personal funds to boost the work of evangelization, Nwanesi has taken the bull by the horn to fulfil what was to be a future dream for Makurdi Grand Commandery. Okenkenta's dream to

liberate the area has become a reality and he too will be remembered for the hard work he did. We give thanks to God and Nwanesi for this fulfilment. We pray that Bigadier General N.N.N. Nwanesi will live long to see the fruit of his labour just as Okekenta has seen his baby grow to maturity. May Major General Dan Okekenta live long as well to see and assess captains of the ship he built. Although his reward is in heaven the Grand Commandery owes him gratitude. Mention must be made of Brigadier General Rev. Fr. Ralph Madu who stood out clearly to support the Grand president in his quest to get his request granted at Supreme Convention in July 2012. We gladly learnt that among other supporters were Major Gabriel Ehilebo whom we owe thanks. Time may warrant us to meet and express our joy together with the people mentioned as we pray for their good health in long life to celebrate their initiative.



make us shining examples of Catholic gentlemen to promote Christian principles, encourage the practice of civic virtues, instill a better understanding of public responsibilities and model for society a strong Catholic morality.

Fraternity is defined as a group of people associated or formally organized for a common purpose, interest or pleasure. The Knights of St. John International is a perfect example of 'fraternity'. We were started in the latter part of the 1800's by men who strove to capture men's hearts and minds for God, by promoting among members, a loyal devotion to the Church, and a profound respect for Her authority.1 This 'fraternity' helps identify us, the members of the order and the purpose that we are all working towards. Sometimes, I think that we forget that the organization is bigger than any one of us, that we must work together to further the aims of the order.

Unity in our thoughts, words and actions must always be on the forefront of our minds. If we appear to be disorganized, or send different messages to our members or act in ways that are unbecoming a Knight of St. John, then we are not united in purpose. The keystones of unity in the order are secrecy and obedience. As described in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> degree ritual, secrecy is necessary in order to preserve order in our ranks. When we do not keep the affairs of the order a secret, the good name of the order is threatened. Obedience requires that we submit to the laws of the order and to its lawful officers acting in good faith of the order. When we disobey our by-laws and/or superior officers, we are not acting to promote the unity of the order.

Charity, the third pillar of the Knights of St. John International, begins with a love of God and our fellowman. It is also much more than just giving of money. It is how we act and react, how we live our lives. When we live with charity in thought, word and action, we are living life the same way that Christ taught us to live. It is the lifeblood of our noble order. Be charitable to your neighbors, friends and relatives, even when they are not
