and regularly report their progress to the Chairman, who could guide them accordingly. It seems now that no one wishes to get involved.





Workshop for Admin Officers, Commanders, Recording and Corresponding Secretaries, Adjutants, and Financial Secretaries

The need for this workshop was articulated by a committee of four (two brothers and two sisters) chaired by the Grand Secretary, Col. Charles Nwakanma. It spelled out the "modus operandi" which among others included date and venue, resource persons and fees payable by attendants.

The workshop was held at the pastoral centre, Catholic Diocese of Abakaliki, Abakaliki on Thursday March 23, 2017. The first resource person, Col Innocent Diyoke spoke on the "STRATEGIC ROLE OF SECRETARIES, DISTRICT COMMANDERY AND REGIMEN-TAL ADJUTANTS". He traced who a Secretary is, his role and finally relates them to roles assigned to secretaries by KSJI constitution. The secretary is most important official of an organization after the president. According to him "the role of the secretary starts before the meeting, continues during and beyond the meeting.

In the second paper presented by Noble sister Mary Okafor, She traced the evolution of accounting systems in Nigeria to Book keeping, Double-Entry Bookkeeping and Ledgers. Finally she dealt with statement of transactions for presentation to members of a nontrading concern. The receipts and payments accounts and the income and expenditure accounts, she opined that income and expenditure accounts are ideal.

The third paper on the "EFFEC-TIVE ADMINISTRATION OF KNIGHTS OF ST. JOHN INTER-NATIONAL" was delivered by Brig. Gen. Chidi Arinze, the Supreme Subordinate Secretary, Nigeria. He not only gave a brief history of the Order but also listed the echelons of command in the Order.

He opined that "effective administration is synonymous with mastery, obedience and respect to the constitution, bye laws, rules and regulations, code of conduct of our Order and use of gavel where applicable". PORT HARCOURT GRAND COMMANDERY YOUNG BROTHERS AND SISTERS WORKSHOP

It has become a routine in Port Harcourt to offer our Young Brothers Workshop in March every year. This time, our Ladies Auxiliary wanted to be part of the programme organized by the School of Knights. The last two squads of the LAUX numbering eighty four (84) sisters signed in for the programme along with ninety brothers from Edmund Fitzgibbon Squad and Squad. All were initiated in 2016. Monsignor Charles C. Agu, a former Spiritual Adviser to Commandery #460, and Parish Priest of Holy Family Catholic Church, Woji where the two day programme took place, welcomed the Grand Officers and the School Management Board, after the opening Mass.

The principal of the School, Major Ben Iwuoha, presented a lead paper on the 'rough road'. Incidentally, the First Grand Respected President, also delivered a similar paper to the Ladies in a separate setting.

After dinner, Noble Dan Onuoha presented a paper on the history of Port Harcourt Grand Commandery, after a brief review of Catholic Knighthood from the Medieval times through the formation of KSJI in the nineteenth century to the Supreme Subordinate Commandery Nigeria. Col. Steve Ekwelibe, the Grand First Vice President, dealt with the Ethics of the Order and Degrees of the Order.

The Grand President, Brig. General George Ikioumoton, presented a lead paper the next day on Discipline which he said was at the heart of every army. He reviewed breaches of discipline in the Church, at meetings and in civic gatherings and attendant sanctions.

Two papers on health issues were presented on sickle cell anaemia, prostate cancer IV Aids and other diseases ravaging the country.

Captain Silvanus Ukaegbu from Owerri Grand Commandery was invited to assist in drill practices to which two sessions were allotted.

The two day programme was "hailed" by the young brothers and sisters who described it as very profitable for their understanding of the Order and growth in it.

A few days later, the School of Knights was restructured to make its administration 21st century compliant. The School Governing Board now includes a Rector, the military Department and the Office of the Grand Secretary, while the Management team has Finance/Administration, Programs/Technical Services and Welfare. There is now on archivist and/or document control officer – a Librarian.

Easter Charities, 2017

Port Harcourt Grand Commandery reached out to our Bishops during the celebration of the Cathedraticum in their various dioceses. It is during the Cathedraticum that lay members and priests celebrate with and honour their Bishop and show him love for the great work he is doing for them. This year, the Bishop of Port Harcourt Diocese and Bomadi Vicariate received from Port Harcourt Grand Commandery the sum of N100,000.00 each while the Administrator of Aba Diocese received N50,000.00. We have only one Commandery in Aba Diocese.

Our widows benefited from our N500,000.00 Easter Widows' purse. The widows numbered over one hundred and ten but our Widows Committee paid attention to the very needy ones. In a depressed economy, worsened by hyperinflation and insecurity, widows with young children, are the first casualties. Aged widows, who are bedridden, who receive no tangible support from their children, suffer a lot in a society where there is a poor or non-existing social welfare system.

Our Local Commanderies forwarded the names of only eleven widowers. Some of these widowers have on-going business concerns that yield some income, but from the list we could identify two indigent and aged brothers. One of them is totally blind.,

After screening, we came up with forty one widows and widowers, urgently needing a helping hand.

In the face of the staggering needs of these widows and widowers, N500,000.00 was like "drop in the bucket". But we relied on the Lord to multiply it and stretch it for their use as He had done when He used only "five barley loaves and two small fishes" to feed five thousand persons, and had a leftover. John 6:8-10.

Incidentally, one of the widows Lady Oyor, had received the sum of one million naira during our March Joint Grand Board meeting as she was a beneficiary of our Death Benefit Scheme.

The afternoon session closed at 3:00.



sponse from the Grand or Commanderies in the United States to undertake this responsibility. Having said that let us understand that we will hold our convention in 2018 as prescribed by our Constitution. Our greatest problem is that we have always booked a Headquarters Hotel and counted on room nights to pay for the meeting rooms needed. As we all know, the headquarters hotel rate is higher than other hotels in the area. We no longer have the room nights to cover the cost of the meeting rooms, thus we must face that reality and move in a different direction. Presently we are looking at booking the meeting rooms in a hotel or moving to a convention center. This will cost in the area of \$15,000 to \$20,000 dollars, which would have to be split with the Supreme Ladies Auxiliary. Wherever we choose to locate must have hotel's and restaurant's available for those participating. There is a possibility that we may hold the convention in Philadelphia with the stringent work of the members, and Maj. Gen. Martin Bella, but until I receive word from Maj. Gen. Bella, I cannot confirm this to the membership. Please remember that the structure of the convention and the cost of things such as registration, will increase. Still we will do the best we can to defray the cost to the membership.
