SUPREME PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings from your Supreme President! Now that the festive season is behind us, it is time for us all to center our thoughts on growing and moving our organization forward. Your Supreme Executive Board of Directors has been busy during this time period maintaining the operations of our order, making decisions for the betterment of our organization, and insuring order within the Knights of St. John International. Whenever decisions are made, change is soon to follow. Changes happen every day of our lives and we can cope with these changes if we have the full understanding of the facts as to why the changes are needed. Far too many times, the facts are given to officers in position and this information is never passed on to the members, thus creating an uninformed and misguided membership. Any decisions that are rendered will have an adverse effect on the membership somewhere in the chain of our order. Therefore I shall use, and continue to use, this article to inform the membership of decisions made by your Board of Directors and why the decisions were needed.

1.) Dues increase for overseas Knights: Again, the Board of Directors were informed that we were outside the laws of the State of New York's Revitalization Act. It is unlawful for us to maintain a two-tier dues structure. The only way to continue our present two-tier dues structure is to create two different identities of Knights, one being lesser qualified and with less benefits than the other. I am adamantly opposed to this concept; we are all one Knight of St. John International and all members deserve a fair, equal, and just representation under our Supreme Constitution. In order to be in compliance with the State of New York laws, we have three options. One is to raise the dues of our overseas' brothers to that of our United States brothers; two is to cut the dues rates of our United States brothers to that of our overseas brothers; and three is some type of combination of both.

As an act of compliance, and after much review of our resources vs. expenditures, your Supreme Executive Board of Directors saw the need to raise the per capita tax for our overseas brothers by one-half of the total amount of full compliance, or two dollars (\$2.00). I had appointed a Finance and Budget Committee to conduct a full review of this situation and make recommendations at the next session of the Board of Directors. What will be recommended, or what the final decision will be, I honestly cannot tell you at this time. But let us be clear of this, I will not approve any budget that is not balanced, nor will I authorize any expenditures we cannot pay for.

2.) Formulating Supreme Subordinate Commanderies of Liberia,

Sierra Leone, and the United States: At the Supreme Convention of 2016, the Supreme Board of Trustees at the time, approved the recommendation of the Overseas Committee, and approved by the body, to create the three new Supreme Subordinate Commanderies mentioned above. At that time it became the responsibility of the newly approved Supreme Executive Board of Directors to insure that these Commanderies are formed and directed in the full extent of our Supreme Constitution. The Board of Directors chose to appoint the needed officers until a full slate of officers can be duly elected by the membership in 2019. There is much work that must transpire in the formation of these Commanderies; By-Laws drawn up, per-capita structure, constitutional re-

sponsibilities, conducting orderly meetings, etc.; and it is our liability to insure all is in working order. By the time you read this article, your appointed Supreme Subordinate officers should be in place, and a new beginning should have already started forming. I ask that all members work together, peacefully and cooperatively, to insure your success.

Until my next article, I ask the Lord's Blessing for peace and health to all our members and their families. May the Lord watch over us and make us better Catholic gentlemen and better Knights of St. John members.
