These as submitted, will appear in the March, 2018, and June, 2018, issues of the Knights Journal and be discussed and voted on at the Supreme Board Meeting and Supreme Convention, in Philadelphia, PA, in July, 2018.

The first proposal for consideration is prepared and submitted by the Supreme Constitution Committee after being approved by unanimous vote of the Supreme Executive Board at their meeting held in Philadelphia, PA in October, 2017.

# PROPOSAL #1

BE IT RESOLVED - That the Supreme Commandery Restructure Committee approved for presentation the following amendments to the Constitution of the Knights of St. John, International. The purpose of these resolutions is to document the specific changes required for the creation of the Supreme Executive Board of Directors and Supreme Advisory Board of Directors, replacing the Supreme Board of Trustees as adopted at the Supreme International Convention held in Buffalo, NY in 2016. The resolutions will define the new boards and replace all references to the Board of Trustees with the Executive Board of Directors. They will also address the expansion of the Supreme Subordinate Commanderies from two (Ghana and Nigeria) to five (Ghana, Nigeria, Sierra Leone, Liberia and the United States.

The Supreme Executive Board of Directors will meet four (4) times a year when there is sufficient business to warrant a meeting. Quorum for the Supreme Executive Board meetings will be one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the voting members of the Executive Board

The Supreme Advisory Board meeting will be held bi-annually to coincide with a meeting of the Supreme Executive Board. Quorum for the Advisory Board meetings will be one-quarter (1/4) of the voting members of the Advisory Board. The Advisory Board will make recommendations only to the Executive Board. The recommendations will be presented by the Chair, Secretary or a designated member of the Advisory Board. Standing Committee Chairmen, such as Supreme Undersecretaries, Inspector General, Membership Committee Chairman, etc., may bring items to the Advisory Board for discussion and inclusion with those items brought to the Executive Board. The Chair of the Advisory Board meetings will be the Immediate Past Supreme President or, if not available, a designated representative assigned by the Supreme President. The Secretary for the Advisory Board meetings will be a member of the Supreme Secretariat assigned by the Supreme Secretary. These members will not have a vote except for the Chair, who will have a vote in case of a tie. The Supreme Counsel will attend the Advisory Board meeting if it does not conflict with the Executive Board meeting but will be available if needed. # **RESOLUTION ‡1**

The Supreme Constitution on page 16 to 17 which nowreads as follows:

CHAPTER II

Supreme Commandery

**OFFICERS** 

SECTION 1

At each Supreme Convention, the following officers of the Supreme Commandery shall be elected:

- A. Supreme President, who by virtue of his office is Commander-in-Chief and ranks as General. He shall not be elected for more than two consecutive terms.
- B. One Supreme First Vice President with the rank of Lieutenant-General.
- C. One Supreme Second Vice President with the rank of Lieutenant-General. (See a. below)
- D. One Supreme Secretary, who by virtue of his office shall be the Adjutant-General and rank as Lieutenant-General. He shall be elected for the first term and shall thereafter continue in office subject to removal for cause.
- E. One Supreme Treasurer, who by virtue of his office shall be Paymaster-General and rank as Lieutenant-General.
- F. Two Supreme Trustees, who by virtue of their office will rank as Major-General.
- a. Only Knights of St. John who are residents of the United States of America shall be eligible for positions to offices of Supreme President, Supreme First Vice President, Supreme Secretary and Supreme Treasurer.

Each elective officer of the Supreme Commandery shall be elected by ballot and all officers shall be elected separately by a majority of the votes cast.

All officers-elect shall be installed and assume office at the session at which they are elected.

All officers except the two Supreme Trustees shall be elected to serve for a term of two (2) years or until such time as their successors have been elected, qualified and installed. The Supreme Trustees shall be elected for four (4) years, except when filling an unexpired term. One third of the Supreme Executive Board shall constitute a quorum at any properly constituted meeting of the Supreme Executive Board of Directors for the transaction of business.

At each Supreme Convention, the following officers of the Supreme Commandery shall be elected:

- B. One Supreme First Vice President with the rank of Lieutenant-General.
- C. One Supreme Second Vice President with the rank of Lieutenant-General.
- D. One Supreme Secretary, who by virtue of his office shall be the Adjutant-General and rank as Lieutenant-General. He shall be elected for the first full term and shall thereafter continue in office for not more than four consecutive two year terms or upon attaining the age of eighty (80) years, whichever comes first. He may however be removed from office at any time for just cause.
- E. One Supreme Treasurer, who by virtue of his office shall be Paymaster-General and rank as Lieutenant-General.
- F. Two Supreme Trustees, who by virtue of their office will rank as Major-General.

SECTION 1A: Eligibility to hold Supreme Elective Office

Any member of Knights of St. John International who at the time of his election is of good standing, and has been exemplified into the Second and Third, the Fourth, and the Fifth Degrees of the Order and is attested to by his Grand President shall be eligible to hold any elective office of the Supreme Commandery.

SECTION 1B: Election, Installation and Term of Office

Each elective officer of the Supreme Commandery shall be elected by ballot and all officers shall be elected separately by a majority of the votes cast.

All officers-elect shall be installed and assume office at the session at which they are elected.

All officers except the two Supreme Trustees shall be elected to serve for a term of two (2) years or until such time as their successors have been elected, qualified and installed. The two Supreme Trustees shall be elected for four (4) years, except when filling an unexpired term. One third of the Supreme Executive Board, which shall include at least four (4) elected officers, shall constitute a quorum at any properly constituted meeting of the Supreme Executive Board of Directors for the transaction of business.



# **RESOLUTION ‡2**

The Supreme Constitution Chapter II, Section 23, which now reads as follows:

#### SECTION 23

Any provision in this Constitution to the contrary notwithstanding, in case a vacancy occurs in any elective Supreme office, other than by the expiration of a term, the same shall be filled in the following manner: The Supreme First Vice-President shall succeed the Supreme President, the Second Vice-President shall succeed the First Vice-President, unless the Second Vice-President is not a resident of the United States of America at the time such vacancy occurs, in which event the office of Supreme First Vice-President shall be filled until the next Convention by appointment made by the Supreme Board. All other vacancies, including the office of Supreme Second Vice-President, shall be filled until the next Convention by appointment made by the Supreme Board. If at the time of the next Convention an office so filled by appointment has an unexpired term, the same shall be filled by election for the unexpired term.

The above should be amended to read as follows:

# **SECTION 23 Vacancies - Supreme Officers**

Any provision in this Constitution to the contrary notwithstanding, in case a vacancy occurs in any elective Supreme office, other than by expiration of a term, the same shall be filled in the following manner: The Supreme First Vice President shall succeed the Supreme President, The Supreme Second Vice President shall succeed the Supreme First Vice President. All other vacancies, including the office of the Supreme Second Vice President, shall be filled until the next Convention by appointment made by

the Supreme Board. If at the time of the next Convention an office so filled by appointment has an unexpired term, the same shall be filled by election for the unexpired term.

# **RESOLUTION ‡3**

Insert the following in the Supreme Constitution to read:

# **SECTION 35 - Voting by Proxy**

A proxy vote shall be allowed in a situation where prior notification on the issue to be voted upon has been published in the Knight of St. John Journal for assimilation by all members of the Knights of St. John International before the Supreme Convention where voting shall take place. Amendments to the Supreme Constitution are typical of this situation.

Procedures to Proxy Voting shall be as follows:

- 1. Only Officers and Delegates to the Supreme Convention shall have the right to cast proxy votes on behalf of other delegates not present at the Convention where voting is taking place.
- 2. All delegates requiring proxy votes must notify the Supreme Secretary at least thirty (30) clear days before commencement of the Convention on a duly filled prescribed Proxy Voter's Form to be issued by the Supreme Secretariat.
- 3. A Proxy voter must hold a copy of the duly filled Proxy Voter's Form together with the Credential form of the delegate requesting the proxy vote and a processing fee of Five U. S. Dollars (US\$ 5.00), to be presented to the Supreme Secretary at the Convention for authentication.

# Supreme Subordinate Commandery ~ Liberia

Liberia loses a stalwart Knight Thursday, April 26 was a day of shock and grief as the news of the death of Brig. General S. Alexander Sonpon spread within the Knights of St. John community in Liberia. He died at a local hospital after a brief illness.

BG Sonpon joined the Order as a member of St. Patrick Commandery #448. His hard work and dedication saw him rise in the ranks of #448 to the positon of Worthy President. His astute leadership in #448 propelled him to positions in the then Liberia Grand Commandery (LGC) where he served as second and first Vice Grand President.

Upon his ascendency to the Grand Presidency in 2004, BG Sonpon set out to reawaken the spirit of knighthood in Liberia. During his administration, he was instrumental in reactivating several dormant commanderies, especially those in the difficultly accessible southeasternregion; establish several new ones in the rural parts of the country; established links with suppliers of KSJI uniforms in Ghana enabling brothers to acquire affordable uniforms. This was a welcome development as many brothers were now able to acquire the appropriate uniform. Within a short time, not only did the number of uniform bothers increase but also brothers could now effectively serve in the uniform ranks.

Realizing that a brigade district could no longer effectively manage the large number of Commanderies within the LGC, he sought permission to have the brigade dissolve and replaced by five districts consisting of a regimental district and four battalion districts. He also worked assiduously for the reactivation of the Bishop John Collins Chapter of Chevaliers #16 in 2007. The Chapter, established in 1988, was dormant during the 14 years of the civil war and up to its reactivation in 2007. BG Sonpon led the established of the Noble Temple in 2008 and served as its first Grand Mas-

Regionally he forged close ties with brothers and sisters in Ghana, Nigeria, Sierra Leone, and Togo. This relationship was essential in Liberia knights acquiring knowledge of the rituals and practices of the Order due to the scarcity of older brothers to impart this due to the toll of the civil war and the establishment of the informal West African Summit.

His work was not only limited to the Order. He was also a dedicated member of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish.

The internment of the body of BGS. Alexander Sonpon will be on May 26, 2018 after Mass of the Resurrection at his parish.

# Col. Lewis R. Kaidjuway to receive the Jewel of Honor

Noble Knight Col. Lewis R. Kaidjuway of Sacred Heart Commandery #366 on Sunday, May 6, 2018 will make history when he will becomes the first Knight in Liberia to receive the Jewel of Honor (nonmilitary). Initiated on January 20, 1976, he has served faithfully in the Order holding several positions not only within his Commandery, where he still serves as chairman of the visitation committee, but also in the erstwhile Liberia Grand Commandery and one of its successors, the Monrovia Grand. He was the first cadet organizer in Liberia.

Col. Kaidjuway is a staunch member of the Sacred Heart Cathedral Parish in Monrovia where he served as a member of the St. Cecelia Choir from 1975 to 2008 when failing eyesight caused him to retire. In appreciation of his services to Holy Mother the Church, the late Holy Father; St. John Paul II awarded him the Benemerenti Medal in 1999.
