You are hereby respectfully commanded to order a Muster & Inspection of all Local Commanderies. Said Muster & Inspection to be held not later than January 15, 2019. You will submit a full and detailed report of the results of said inspection not later than May 15, 2019.

To: All Supreme Subordinate Presidents, Grand Presidents, Brigade, Regiment, Battalion, District Commanders and Unattached Local Commandery Presidents:

In compliance with General Order No. 1, issued by General Frank Waseleski, Sr., dated September 1, 2018; you are hereby respectfully commanded to order a Muster & Inspection of all Local Commanderies within your jurisdiction to be held no later than January 15, 2019. Said Muster & Inspection to be conducted as prescribed in the official Knights of St. John International Drill Regulations (Reprinted, June 2008), Sections 486-496. KSJI Muster & Inspection Report Forms 1 & 2 (KSJI MIR Forms 1 & 2) will be sent to you and you will send two copies of KSJI MIR Form 1 to each Local Commandery Commander, within your jurisdiction, to prepare the muster roll for their Local Commandery. The Local Commandery Commanders will present the two KSJI MIR Forms 1 to the Muster and Inspecting Officer(s). The Muster and Inspecting Officer(s) will complete the Muster Roll for each Local Commandery annotating on the two KSJI Forms 1 those members present or absent. The Muster and Inspecting Officer(s) will then complete the Inspection of each Local Commandery annotating on the two KSJI MIR Forms 1 the inspection of uniform items. One completed KSJI MIR Form 1 will be retained by the Local Commandery Commander for future reference and one sent to each District Commander, or in Brigades to the Colonel of each Regiment. As soon as these reports are received from all Local Commanderies, the Colonel or District Commander will transfer the information contained therein to the KSJI MIR Forms 2. When the KSJI MIR Forms 2 is complete, the Colonel or District Commander will have a number of copies made. The Colonel or District Commander will submit the KSJI MIR Forms 2 to their Supreme Subordinate Commandery or Grand Commandery who will compile all of their subordinate commands KSJI MIR Forms 2 for follow on submission to the KSJI, Supreme Commandery, Inspector General no later than January 15, 2019. 
### Unattached Commandery

### Closing the Deal: The Importance of Being Ready

For the first time in recent memory, the Michigan Grand Commandery's St. Joseph Commandery #239 will finish the year with more members than it began with, and isn't by accident or luck. The Detroit Regiment's efforts to recruit new members in a deliberate, meaningful way has grown the audience of those who know the Knights, what we represent, and what we do significantly. The three new members initiated into the Commandery in 2018 are all from this pool, men who hadn't known of the Knights before and, when they learn about our order, were invited to join.

The bridge among our perspective members from enthusiastic interest to receiving the first degree, though, can be too far. This is a place where we can have a real impact immediately and with very little effort, and without pestering a perspective member with phone calls and repeated attempts to re-engage. Follow this handful of guidelines the next time you're at a turnout (and every time, I hope!):

1. Always have applications ready. If possible, give a blank application to all of your members turning out and ask them to keep it inside the uniform's jacket pocket with a pen. In Detroit, we lose the greatest majority of perspective members between collecting contact information and following-up through e-mail or telephone calls. With an interested



applicant, there's no commitment in filling out the application, but it's a significant barrier out of the way, right away. With a completed application in-hand, that's one fewer hurdle you're asking an otherwise enthusiastic new member to clear.

2. Know how your applicant communicates. All of Detroit's new members this year find it easiest to communicate through Facebook messenger. Some men prefer e-mail, while others prefer phone calls or face-to-face interaction. As an application proceeds through your Com-

mandery's acceptance process, this will be important as you're keeping your perspective new member informed. Which leads us to:

3. Keep your new applicant informed through the process. The process to join the Knights isn't cumbersome—an application, followed by an investigation committee, then a vote at a regular meeting. Depending on the frequency of your meetings, however, this could potentially be a two-month process (or more), so keeping your applicant informed as to where their application sits is crucial. Aside from reminding them that their application isn't forgotten (and that it is, indeed, important to us), they gain important insight into how your Commandery operates—an important step as you seek to bring them into the fold.




